Why Should You Recycle?

Recycling prevents resource destruction. By recycling you send discarded items back to manufacturers to make new products. Americans already produce 254 million tons of trash yearly and only about 34.3 % of that is recycled. The percentage of air and water pollution is decreased when you recycle and we also save energy and money. Accepted Items at Taney County Recycle Center:

- **Aluminum:** Cans Only
- **Cardboard:** Flattened boxes, No wax coated boxes
- **Glass:** Clear & Colored with no lids, No Pyrex or Ceramic
- **Paper:** All Paper, Magazines, Newspaper and Books. Please bag shredded paper separate.
- **Tin:** All tin cans rinsed
- **Plastic:** Bottles & Jugs



Not Accepted:

- No plastic bags, bubble wrap or wrappers
- No black plastics
- No contaminated food containers
- No pharmaceutical bottles/ vitamin bottles
- No aluminum foil or foil containers
- No furniture
- No Medical waste, needles, syringes or oxygen tubing
- No plastic silverware or styrofoam
- No batteries or cell phones
- No light bulbs
- No blueprints
