NOW, THEREFORE IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual considerations and obligations of the parties contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Contract Documents. The contract documents to this Agreement shall include the Contractor's bid response to County's Request For Bid# 202104-475 and any applicable addenda which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Product or Services data, specifications and literature submitted may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office. In the event of a conflict between any of the foregoing Contract Documents, and this Agreement, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall prevail and control.
- 2. Contract Price. County agrees to purchase, and Contractor agrees to sell labor, materials, and equipment for an HVAC Replacement System, which includes removal and installation of air handler, suspended ceiling and 6-ton high efficiency Heat Pump (AC & Heater Unit) with related accessories and services as described in the Contract Documents for the Taney County Airport in Hollister, Missouri for the price not to exceed \$14,588.70. If certain unusual circumstances occur specific to Equipment availability, the County may consider all other options.
- 3. Contract Duration. This agreement shall commence on the date it is fully executed and terminate upon expiration of all applicable warranties as listed within the attached Contract Documents. This agreement may only be extended by the order of the County subject to the pricing, and delivery clauses as agreed to, and offered by the Proposal.
- 4. Billing and Payment. All billing must be invoiced with specific department information. Billings and invoices may only include the prices provided for via this Agreement. No additional fees or extra services not included, or taxes, shall be included as additional charges in excess of the charges in this Agreement or the Contract Documents. The County agrees to pay all correct statements within thirty days of receipt; Contractor agrees to honor any cash or prompt payment discounts, if any are available, when County makes payment as provided therein. In the event of a billing dispute, the County reserves the right to withhold payment on the disputed amount.
- <u>5. Binding Effect.</u> This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns for so long as this Agreement remains in full force and effect.
- <u>6. Entire Agreement.</u> This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior negotiations, written or verbal, and any other bid or bid specification or contractual Agreement. This Agreement may only be amended by a signed writing executed with the same formality as this Agreement.

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") dated the _____ day of May, 2021 is made between Taney County, Missouri, a political subdivision of the State of Missouri (hereinafter "County") and Southwest Missouri Forensics (hereinafter "Contractor").

NOW, THEREFORE IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual agreements and obligations of the parties contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Contract Documents</u>. The Contract Documents to this Agreement shall include the Contractor's Letter dated April 20, 2021 in response to County's Request, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference ("Contract Documents"). In the event of a conflict between any of the foregoing Contract Documents and this Agreement, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall prevail and control.
- 2. <u>Services; Contract Price.</u> Contractor agrees to provide a board-certified pathologist to complete autopsies on deaths (including, but not limited to violent, suspicious, accidental, or unexpected natural deaths)., as needed and requested by the Taney County Coroner, or Deputy Coroner. Contractor agrees to complete and provide autopsy reports in a timely manner to the office of Coroner. Contractor agrees to work cooperatively with the Coroner, law enforcement agencies, and Prosecuting Attorney. Contractor agrees to provide the following services to the County at the prices set forth below:

Autopsy and basic toxicology panel - \$2,100 External Examination - \$850 X-Ray - \$250 Decomposed body - \$300

(collectively "Services"). Contractor agrees to complete and maintain a file for each case handled by Contractor and agrees to make the file available to the County.

Additional testing may be requested on an "as needed" basis at an additional cost, the cost of which will be provided to the Coroner prior to performance of said testing, and which must be approved by the Coroner or designee prior to completing the additional testing.

3. <u>Contract Duration</u>. This Agreement shall commence on the date it is signed by both parties and shall continue until December 31, 2021 (the "Term"), subject to the provisions for termination specified below. This Agreement may be renewed beyond the initial term by the order of the County for up to three (3) additional twelve (12) month periods (each a "Renewal Term") subject to the condition that there shall be no cost increases for the renewal term. If Contractor proposes changes to cost, Contractor agrees to notify the County of any proposed changes in cost for a Renewal Term at least thirty (30) days prior to the termination date of the Term, or any Renewal Term.
