INTRODUCTION & BASIC PROCESSING INFORMATION:

A formal invitation for bid is utilized when any total purchase estimate exceeds \$6,000. The County also uses this method when the life of a term and supply contract is valued more than \$6,000. A complete bid request package will contain well-defined standard technical specifications for the nature of the service or product(s) requested. A formal closing date and time is specified. The Bidder must comply with this requirement in order to be considered for award.

The Purchasing Department is responsible for the bid opening at the time and place noted in this solicitation. If a Vendor wants a copy of the bid tabulation they must include a direct email address, not website, in order to receive results. Obviously sealed bids cannot be emailed so they must either be delivered by hand, courier, or U.S.P.S. (Please note U.S.P.S. concerns as listed in item #1.3 on the following page.)

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All formal invitations for bid are handled by the Taney County Purchasing Department. However, technical requirements and product specifications are the responsibility of the specific requesting department as listed in sections #2 & #3.

Read ALL solicitation documents closely - immediately upon receipt. Note any/all special dates and submit your response as soon as possible. See Items 1.21-1.27 for the process to submit questions. Pay close attention to the terms *must*, *will*, *shall*, *should* or *may*.

- 2.1 The Taney County Purchasing Department will accept bids for Asphalt Materials as listed within the following specifications. Interested parties should complete the following information requests, as asked for, with their lowest possible prices.
- 2.2 All pricing MUST remain in effect, available without increase, for one year from date of award.
- 2.3 Surcharges OF ANY NATURE, will <u>NOT</u> be accepted or paid for during the full course of the awarded period.
- The County will <u>NOT</u> be required to purchase any/all, nor minimums/maximums as per the quantities listed within this solicitation. (Listed quantities are annual estimates.)
- 2.5 All materials shall be in accordance with the requirements of the 2004 Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction and/or following specifications.
- Material quantities shown on the material solicitation represent an <u>estimate</u> and should not be taken as commitment by the county as to the quantity of material that will be used during the 2020-2021 maintenance year.
- 2.7 Submitted pricing by the awarded Vendor shall remain in force for a minimum of twelve months from the date of award.
- 2.8 All materials MUST be a "virgin mix" per MoDOT requirement #BP-1.
- 2.9 Missouri's Prevailing Wage Law: <u>Annual Wage Order No. 26 for Taney County</u> is attached as a separate document to this solicitation to assist the awarded Vendor to comply. This solicitation requires compliance. See item #4.3 on page #8.
- 2.10 Taney County reserves the right to have the material tested for quality at their expense and to take whatever remedial action that may be required. Tests would be run to verify compliance with the applicable specifications.
- 2.11 All material is to be furnished to the County in accordance with directions given on the material bid.
- 2.12 Bids may be awarded for each group listed and may be awarded to more than one supplier based upon the lowest on the road cost. Taney County reserves the right to reject any and or all bids and to waive any and or all technicalities.

- 3. Contract Duration. This agreement shall commence on the date it is fully executed and extend for 12 months subject to the provisions for termination specified below. This agreement may only be extended by the order of the County for one (1) additional one (1) year period subject to the pricing, and delivery clauses as agreed to, not to exceed 5%, and offered by the Contractor's bid response. This agreement may be renewed thereafter on a month to month basis for up to six months in the event the County is unable to re-bid and award a new contract prior to expiration.
- 4. Billing and Payment. All billing shall be invoiced with specific department information and include bid reference #202003-445 for tracking. Billings and invoices may only include the prices provided for in this Agreement. No additional fees or extra services not included, or taxes, shall be included as additional charges in excess of the charges in this Agreement or the Contract Documents. The County agrees to pay all correct statements within thirty days of receipt; Contractor agrees to honor any cash or prompt payment discounts, if any are available, when County makes payment as provided therein. In the event of a billing dispute, the County reserves the right to withhold payment on the disputed amount. In the event the billing dispute is resolved in favor of the Contractor, the County agrees to pay interest at a rate of 9% per annum on disputed amounts withheld commencing from the last date that payment was due.
- <u>5. Binding Effect.</u> This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns for so long as this Agreement remains in full force and effect.
- <u>6. Entire Agreement.</u> This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior negotiations, written or verbal, and any other bid or bid specification or contractual Agreement. This Agreement may only be amended by a signed writing executed with the same formality as this Agreement.
- <u>7. Termination.</u> This Agreement may be terminated by the County upon thirty days advance written notice for any of the following reasons or under any of the following circumstances:
 - a. Due to material breach of any term or condition of this Agreement, or
 - b. If in the opinion of the Taney County Commission delivery of products is delayed or products delivered are not in conformity with specifications or variances authorized by County, or
 - c. If appropriations are not made available and budgeted for any calendar year.
- 8. Governing Law; Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Missouri. Venue for any dispute arising out of the formation, interpretation, or claims regarding a breach of this Agreement shall be solely and exclusively in the Circuit Court of Taney County Missouri.

OVERTIME

For all work performed on a Sunday or a holiday, not less than twice (2x) the prevailing hourly rate of wages for work of a similar character in the locality in which the work is performed or the public works contracting minimum wage, whichever is applicable, shall be paid to all workers employed by or on behalf of any public body engaged in the construction of public works, exclusive of maintenance work.

For all overtime work performed, not less than one and one-half (1½) the prevailing hourly rate of wages for work of a similar character in the locality in which the work is performed or the public works contracting minimum wage, whichever is applicable, shall be paid to all workers employed by or on behalf of any public body engaged in the construction of public works, exclusive of maintenance work or contractual obligation. For purposes of this subdivision, "overtime work" shall include work that exceeds ten hours in one day and work in excess of forty hours in one calendar week; and

A thirty-minute lunch period on each calendar day shall be allowed for each worker on a public works project, provided that such time shall not be considered as time worked.
