ADDENDUM TO THE AMENDED SEWER SERVICES AND EXCLUSIVE TERRITORIAL AGREEMENT

THIS ADDENDUM, is made and entered into this _____ day of ______, 2019, by and between the TANEY COUNTY REGIONAL SEWER DISTRICT, (hereinafter DISTRICT), TANEY COUNTY, MISSOURI, (hereinafter COUNTY), and the CITY OF BRANSON, a City of the Fourth Class, State of Missouri, (hereinafter CITY).

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the COUNTY, the CITY and the DISTRICT entered into a SEWER SERVICES AND EXCLUSIVE TERRITORIAL AGREEMENT dated on or about February 28, 2000, copy attached hereto and incorporated herein as "Exhibit 1", which was amended on or about October 23, 2006, copy attached hereto and incorporated herein as "Exhibit 2", and desire to amend these Agreements to address the current need for wastewater collection, transfer and treatment in the Emory Creek Watershed; and

WHEREAS, the safe and adequate disposal of sanitary sewage, within close proximity to the CITY is a continuing concern to the CITY in protecting the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the CITY; and

WHEREAS, the CITY, COUNTY and DISTRICT desire to assure responsible wastewater management in the Emory Creek Ranch Subdivision, (hereinafter SUBDIVISION); and

WHEREAS, Emory Creek Ranch Property Owner's Association has requested the DISTRICT to accept ownership and operations responsibility for the SUBDIVISION sanitary sewer collection and wastewater treatment systems; and

FILL DIRT AGREEMENT

COMES NOW the Taney County Commission on behalf of Taney County, Missouri, (hereinafter "Taney County") and enters into this agreement with <u>Don wey bologic</u> (hereinafter Owner), regarding the dumping of dirt fill on Owner's property, anothe particulars of the agreement are as follows:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Taney County, Missouri's Road and Bridge Department would benefit from a location near ongoing construction to dump excess and unneeded fill dirt; and,

WHEREAS, having said location would save Taney County's Road and Bridge Department a considerable amount in hauling costs; and

WHEREAS, Owner will benefit from having needed fill dirt dumped on Owner's property;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS AGREED AND COVENANTED BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

General Provisions.

Taney County, as the need arises, is granted permission by Owner to dump fill dirt upon locations on Owner's property that Owner has previously designated to receive such material.

Term and Notice.

The term of this agreement shall commence upon the first date upon which all parties have signed this agreement and shall continue until terminated by one party or the other.

Hold Harmless

Owner agrees that it will hold Taney County, its employees, representatives, heirs and assigns harmless from any claims arising from or relating to this agreement except for any gross negligence.

program outcomes you plan to achieve as well as the function and operation of the project. Jesus Was Homeless (JWH) is applying to NAP for the Community Connections Continuum of Care. This continuum begins through weekly meal delivery to over 1,200 homeless and/or impoverished residents in Branson, specifically those living in extended-stay motels along Highway 76. In 2018, over 62,000 meals were served. These sack lunch style "Happy Meals" are more than just a sandwich as they open doors to building relationships with Branson's most marginalized people, which allow Jesus Was Homeless to connect individuals and families to "next steps" through coordinated Case Management. Case Mangers assess the needs of each individual or family and connect them to the appropriate resources to help pull them out of poverty. These resources may be immediate like food and shelter, or may be long-term such as stable employment and/or permanent housing. Goals for the Community Connections Continuum of Care program include: 1) Annually, Community Connections will provide case management to 500 individuals and families (total 1,500 over 36 month period); 2) Annually, 375 individuals and families will have an increased understanding of steps to get out of poverty as measured by pre/post test; and 3) Annually, 250 individuals and families will have decreased risk factors directly attributable to Community Connections as measured through case management notes (total of 750 over 36 month period).
