THIS AGREEMENT dated the <u>III</u> day of January 2021 is made between Taney County, Missouri, a political subdivision of the State of Missouri, (hereinafter "County") and Frank Fletcher Automotive No. 7, LLC dba Frank Fletcher Toyota of Joplin, Missouri (hereinafter "Contractor").

NOW, THEREFORE IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual consideration and obligations of the parties contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

The County agrees to pay all correct statements within thirty days of receipt; Contractor agrees to honor any cash or prompt payment discounts, if any are available, when County makes payment as provided therein.
