## AGREEMENT for Impact Notice Postcards

THIS AGREEMENT dated the 29th day of Morch 2021 is made between Taney County, Missouri, a political subdivision of the State of Missouri, (hereinafter "County") and Diversified Companies, LLC (hereinafter "Vendor").

NOW, THEREFORE IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual considerations and obligations of the parties contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Contract Documents. The Contract Documents to this Agreement shall consist of this Agreement for Impact Notice Postcards ("Service"), County's Request For Bid #202103-472, Vendor's bid response, and any applicable addenda which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Service or product data, specifications and literature submitted may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office. In the event of a conflict between any of the foregoing Contract Documents, and this Agreement, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall prevail and control.
- 2. Contract Price. Service provided under this Agreement shall not exceed the total contract price as quoted in the attached bid response, not to exceed \$7,926, based on a quantity of 23,000 including labor, ink, postage and tracking ("Contract Price"). In the event the County requires quantities in excess of those set forth in the Contract Documents, Vendor shall charge \$0.06 per postcard plus \$0.27 for postage per postcard for quantities in excess of those set forth in the Contract Documents. If certain unusual circumstances occur regarding providing of service, the County may consider all other options, including the next lowest Bidder.
- 3. Contract Duration. This agreement shall commence on the date it is fully executed and terminate upon expiration of all applicable warranties. This Agreement may only be extended by the Order of the County subject to the pricing, and delivery clauses as agreed to, and offered by the Vendors Quote response.
- 4. Billing and Payment. All billing shall be invoiced with specific department information and include bid reference #202103-472 for tracking. Billings and invoices may only include the prices provided for via this Agreement. No additional fees or extra services not included, or taxes, shall be included as additional charges in excess of the charges in this Agreement or the Contract Documents. The County agrees to pay all correct statements within thirty days of receipt; Vendor agrees to honor any cash or prompt payment discounts, if any are available, when County makes payment as provided therein. In the event of a billing dispute, the County reserves the right to withhold payment on the disputed amount.
- <u>5. Binding Effect.</u> This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns for so long as this Agreement remains in full force and effect.

#### AGREEMENT for Mobile Office Software Agreement

NOW, THEREFORE IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual considerations and obligations of the parties contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Contract Documents.</u> The Contract Documents to this Agreement shall consist of this Agreement, the Notice of Intent to Declare Single Source Provider No. 202103-471, and any applicable addenda which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference ("Contract Documents"). Service or product data, specifications and literature submitted may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office. In the event of a conflict between any of the foregoing Contract Documents, and this Agreement, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall prevail and control.
- 2. <u>Contract Duration.</u> This Agreement shall be for a term of thirty-six (36) months beginning on the date fully executed by the parties (the "Term"). This Agreement may only be renewed by agreement of the parties in writing.
- License. Vendor grants County, subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, a personal, non-transferable, and non-exclusive license to use Vendor's Assessor Mobile Office Software Application and associated software products ("License"). County agrees not to copy, decompile or reverse engineer Vendor's proprietary software in any manner or for any purpose, without prior written consent. County agrees that aspects of the licensed materials, including the specific design and structure of Vendor's proprietary software constitute trade secrets and/or copyrighted material. County agrees not to disclose, provide, or otherwise make available such trade secrets or copyrighted material in any form to any third party, without prior written consent. County agrees to implement reasonable security measures to protect such trade secrets and copyrighted material. Vendor's proprietary software is owned by Vendor and is protected by United States copyright laws and international treaties. Any software developed for the County is the sole property of Vendor and becomes Vendor's proprietary software. County data that resides in Vendor's proprietary software is the property of the County and not Vendor. Vendor agrees to keep confidential the County data and not to make any use or disclosure of the County data, unless instructed to do so by the County.
- 4. <u>Annual License and Maintenance.</u> Annual license and maintenance is required for the use of Vendor's proprietary software. Vendor will provide programming services to correct documented program errors which Vendor diagnoses as defects or problems not caused by any use, by the County. Vendor will provide phone support, utilizing the internet for problem resolution. State mandates will be provided at no cost. Installation of and custom programming for the mandates will be chargeable at Vendor's

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into between Taney County, Missouri (hereinafter referred to as "County") and the City of Branson (hereinafter referred to as "City").

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County and City entered into an Inter-Governmental Funding Agreement effective June 01, 2020, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference, for the purpose of completing the items as outlined in the above referenced funding agreement by December 31, 2020. On 12/07/2020, due to delays related to COVID – 19, the County agreed to extend the original agreement termination date to March 31, 2021, copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by reference.

WHEREAS, due to the need for additional detailed design review specific to the Compton Drive WWTP Flood Protection project, the City now request that the agreement termination date be extended a second time to allow additional time for their engineer to complete the work and submit the final invoice for processing and reimbursement request requirements.

WHEREAS, the County agrees to extend the agreement termination date of the above referenced funding agreement to May 31, 2021.

WHEREAS, THE PARTIES AGREE that all other aspects of the agreement for this project remain in effect.
