ADDENDUM TO

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR 911 DISPATCH SERVICES AND PERSONNEL

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THIS ADDENDUM ("Addendum") made this $\underline{24}$ day of July, 2023, by and between Taney County, Missouri ("County") and City of Hollister ("City").

WHEREAS, County and City entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement for 911 Dispatch Services and Personnel dated July 5, 2022 ("Agreement"), attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u>;

WHEREAS, County, and City desire to amend the Agreement pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants set forth herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. The parties agree to amend paragraph 4 of the Agreement to read as follows:

"4. <u>Term:</u> The Effective Date of this Agreement shall be July 7, 2023, and shall end on July 6, 2024. The Agreement shall automatically renew for additional one (1) year terms (each a "Renewal Term") unless either party notifies the other party in writing at least sixty (60) days prior to the termination of the Agreement at the end of any Term, provided that the County may submit proposed changes to the compensation amount pursuant to paragraph 3 due to increases labor costs prior to the beginning of a Renewal Term. In the event the County submits a proposed change to the compensation amount within sixty (60) days of the end of a Term, the City may terminate the Agreement prior to the effective date of the Renewal Term."

2. This Addendum is subject to the Agreement and to each and every term, covenant, condition and agreement set forth therein. County and City continue to be bound by the terms of the Agreement and remain primarily liable under the terms of the Agreement. The Agreement is modified only to the extent provided in paragraph 1, above.

PERFORMANCE WORK STATEMENT (PWS)

Increased Law Enforcement Services, Taney County Bull Shoals Lakes

1. <u>GENERAL</u>: This is a non-personal services contract to provide increased law enforcement services. The Government shall not exercise any supervision or control over the contract service providers performing the services herein. Such contract service providers shall be accountable solely to the Contractor who, in turn is responsible to the Government.

1.1 Description of Services/Introduction: The Contractor shall provide all personnel, equipment, supplies, facilities, transportation, tools, materials, supervision, and other items and non-personal services necessary to perform increased law enforcement services as defined in this Performance Work Statement except for those items specified as government furnished property and services. The Contractor shall perform to the standards in this contract.

1.2. Scope: Taney County agrees to provide a specific level of increased law enforcement services for that part of Bull Shoals Lake lying within Taney County for the purpose of enforcement of state and local criminal and civil laws. Services include vehicular patrol by the contractor of the interior roads of River Run Park, Beaver Creek Park, Oakland Park, and other Federal properties operated and maintained by the Corps of Engineers (Corps) within Taney County. The contractor shall accomplish enforcement of state and local laws, monitoring of visitor use to increase public safety, and assisting Corps of Engineers Rangers with their visitor assistance duties if requested. The Contractor agrees to provide the following reimbursable law enforcement services. Perform daily patrols of the interior roads of the parks in accordance with this PWS during the contract period. When requested by the Corps of Engineers' representative, the Contractor agrees to dispatch an Officer(s), within his manpower capabilities, to unforeseen or emergency situations. This assistance will be considered non-reimbursable.

1.3 Period of Performance: Contractor shall provide described services on certain days of the week during the Period of Performance (POP) May 1 through Sep 30 of each option year. Additional information is in Appendix A. A detailed schedule will be provided at the beginning of each Period of Performance. The effective start date is May 1, 2023, or after the contractor has been notified by the Contracting Officer, Little Rock District, that the contract has been executed, whichever is later.

1.4 General Information

1.4.1 Quality Control: The Contractor will prepare a Daily Enforcement Action Summary in accordance with the attached format (Appendix B) or similar Park Manager approved form. The summary will be completed daily and submitted at the close of each month to the Corps of Engineers representative listed in paragraph 1.4.11 of this plan. A summary of the month's activities will also be submitted at this time. This summary will include a total for verbal warnings, written warnings, citations, and arrests.

Contract Documents.</u> The contract documents to this Agreement to purchase one (1) FORKSSL48 forks attachment ("Equipment") shall include Sales Agreement dated June 7, 2023 and the cooperative purchasing contract documents of Sourcewell Contract #032119-CAT, all of which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A ("Contract Documents"). Contract Documents, Product or Services data, specifications and literature submitted may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office. In the event of a conflict between any of the foregoing Contract Documents, and this Agreement, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall prevail and control.

<u>2. Contract Price.</u> The County agrees to purchase the Equipment from the Contractor and the Contractor agrees to sell to the County the Equipment provided under this Agreement. The Purchase Price shall not exceed \$1,169.10. If certain unusual circumstances occur specific to Equipment availability, the County may consider all other options.

<u>3. Contract Duration.</u> This agreement shall commence on the date it is fully executed and terminate upon expiration of all applicable warranties. This agreement may only be extended by the order of the County subject to the pricing, and delivery clauses as agreed to, and offered by the Contractor's bid response.

<u>4. Billing and Payment.</u> All billing must be invoiced with specific department information. Billings and invoices may only include the prices provided for via this Agreement. No additional fees or extra services not included, or taxes, shall be included as additional charges in excess of the charges in this Agreement or the Contract Documents. The County agrees to pay all correct statements within thirty days of receipt; Contractor agrees to honor any cash or prompt payment discounts, if any are available, when County makes payment as provided therein. In the event of a billing dispute, the County reserves the right to withhold payment on the disputed amount.

5. Binding Effect. This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns for so long as this Agreement remains in full force and effect.

<u>6. Entire Agreement.</u> This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior negotiations, written or verbal, and any other bid or bid specification or contractual Agreement. This Agreement may only be amended by a signed writing executed with the same formality as this Agreement.
