THIS AGREEMENT dated the <u>1146</u> day of <u>September</u> 2023 is made between Taney County, Missouri, a political subdivision of the State of Missouri, (hereinafter "County") and Pomp's Tire Service, Inc. (hereinafter "Contractor").

NOW, THEREFORE IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual considerations and obligations of the parties contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

<u>1. Contract Documents.</u> The contract documents to this Agreement for the purchase of tires, including installation ("Product") shall include the Contractor's bid response to County's Request For Bid #202308-536 and any applicable addenda which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Service or product data, specifications and literature submitted may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office. In the event of a conflict between any of the foregoing Contract Documents, and this Agreement, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall prevail and control.

<u>2. Contract Price.</u> Product provided under this Agreement shall not exceed the price as quoted in the attached bid response in the amount of \$22,242. If certain unusual circumstances occur regarding delivery or product availability, the County may consider all other options, including the next lowest Bidder.

<u>3. Contract Duration.</u> This agreement shall commence on the date it is fully executed and terminate upon expiration of all applicable warranties. This agreement may only be extended by the order of the County subject to the pricing, and delivery clauses as agreed to, and offered by the Contractor's bid response.

<u>4. Billing and Payment.</u> All billing must be invoiced with specific department information. Billings and invoices may only include the prices provided for via this Agreement. No additional fees or extra services not included, or taxes, shall be included as additional charges in excess of the charges in this Agreement or the Contract Documents. The County agrees to pay all correct statements within thirty days of receipt; Contractor agrees to honor any cash or prompt payment discounts, if any are available, when County makes payment as provided therein. In the event of a billing dispute, the County reserves the right to withhold payment on the disputed amount.

<u>5. Binding Effect.</u> This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns for so long as this Agreement remains in full force and effect.

<u>6. Entire Agreement.</u> This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior negotiations, written or verbal, and any other bid or bid specification or contractual Agreement. This Agreement may only be amended by a signed writing executed with the same formality as this Agreement.

THIS AGREEMENT dated the <u>11<sup>th</sup></u> day of <u>September</u> 202<sup>3</sup> is made between Taney County, Missouri, a political subdivision of the State of Missouri, (hereinafter "County") and Princip Defense, LLC (hereinafter "Contractor").

NOW, THEREFORE IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual considerations and obligations of the parties contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

<u>1. Contract Documents.</u> The contract documents to this Agreement for the purchase of specified tactical equipment ("Equipment") shall include the Contractor's bid response to County's Request For Bid #202307-535 and any applicable addenda which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Service or product data, specifications and literature submitted may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office. In the event of a conflict between any of the foregoing Contract Documents, and this Agreement, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall prevail and control.
