How To Safely Transport For Drop -Off

- Put all items in a cardboard box or a reusable container. **NO bags!**
- Make sure all lids or tops are tightly sealed to prevent leaks.
- Keep products in original container
- If product is leaking, place in an air tight plastic container, surrounded by a clay based cat litter type fill to absorb any spilling.
- Place products in an upright position.
