INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this _____ day of February, 2025 ("Effective Date"), by and between Taney County, Missouri ("County"), a county of the first classification and the Village of Taneyville, Missouri ("Village"), a Missouri village.

WHEREAS, section 70.220, RSMo. permits political subdivisions to contract and cooperate with one another for the planning, development, construction, acquisition or operation of any public improvement or facility or common service; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to receive from County and County desires to provide to Village salt for winter road maintenance; and

WHEREAS, The Village desires to provide snow removal on certain roads within Villagand maintained by the County.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants set forth herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Road Salt.</u> The County Shall make road salt available to the Village on an asneeded basis during winter months and when snow and ice storms are forecasted. The Village shall be responsible for picking up all road salt at County Road and Bridge storage facilities and shall bear all costs of transporting and spreading road salt.

2. <u>Snow Removal.</u> The Village shall provide snow removal services on the following roads located within the Village on an as-needed basis:

Charles Street (0.27 miles) Beall Road (0.94 miles) Emerald Street (0.06 miles) Park Street (0.22 miles)

The Village shall provide at its own cost such snow removal services subject to the County's established snow removal procedures, priorities, and route scheduling. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed or construed to require the County to give precedence to the above roads over any other road maintained by the County or to alter its standard practices for determining snow removal schedules and routes.

3. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Agreement shall be from the Effective Date set forth above and shall be effective for one (1) year thereafter. This Agreement shall automatically renew for subsequent terms of one (1) year unless terminated by either party by providing sixty (60) days' prior notice to the other party.

4. <u>Liability.</u> County agrees that it shall be responsible for any and all claims, losses, and liabilities, of any nature whatsoever, to persons or property arising from the negligent or wrongful acts or omissions of the County, its employees, agents, and representatives in the performance of this Agreement, without waiving their sovereign, governmental, or official
